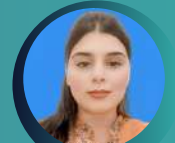

CISS SUMMER WORKSHOP ON STRATEGIC MATTERS FOR KIU DELEGATION



The Center for International Strategic Studies Islamabad recently held a five-day workshop on strategic matters, featuring delegations from Karakoram International University Gilgit and University of Baltistan, Skardu from 12-15 February, 2024. The discussions explored the evolving global and regional security environments, the significance of nuclear deterrence, and strategic stability in South Asia, with particular emphasis on the impacts of global power competition, notably the Sino-US rivalry in the Asia-Pacific region.

The presentations shed light on the challenges to strategic stability posed by India's military developments and its refusal to engage in peace initiatives, alongside Pakistan's commitment to a peaceful South Asia and its reliance on nuclear deterrence as a defense strategy. Additionally, the workshop addressed the use of nuclear technology for peaceful purposes in Pakistan, the socio-economic benefits derived from it, and the geostrategic significance of Gilgit-Baltistan.

A distinguished delegation from the Center for International Strategic Studies Islamabad (CISS) visited CISS AJK on 04 May 2024. 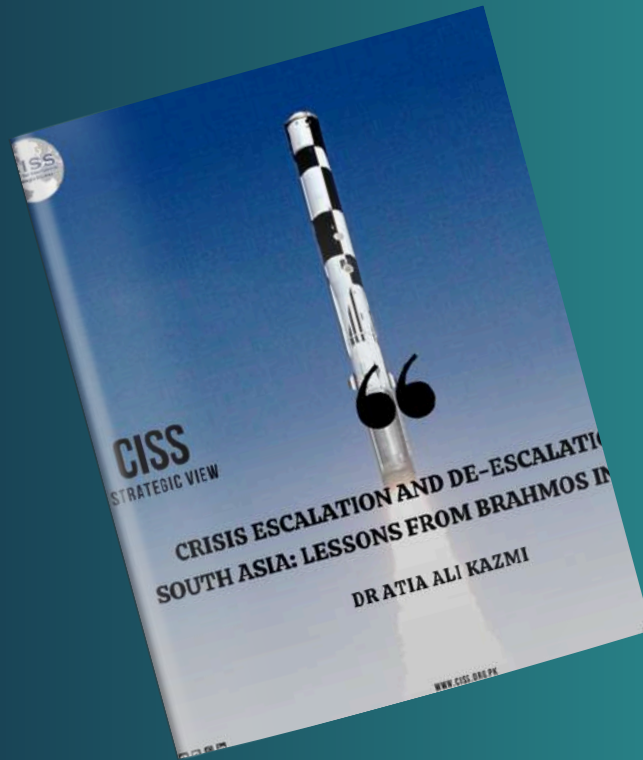

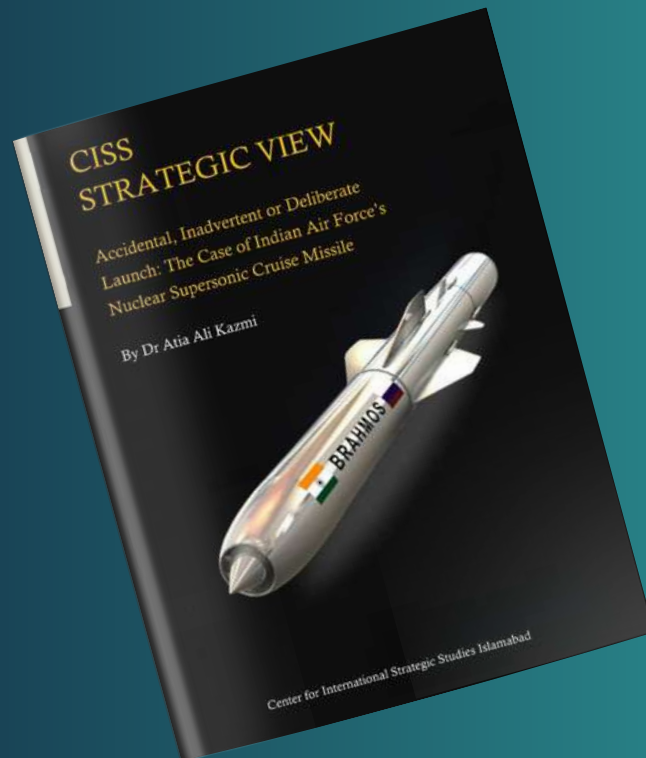

In the 2019 Kashmir crisis, later the BrahMos incident in 2022, and the recent Iranian misadventure, Pakistan has amply shown that it retains the flexibility to respond promptly to provocations. While Pakistan exercised restraint in 2022, in the future, it may go for the quid-pro-quo (QPQ) and call the Indian bluff. Pakistan remains alive to the pulsating threats and, in the wake of India irresponsible actions, will take all steps to maintain Full-Spectrum Deterrence.

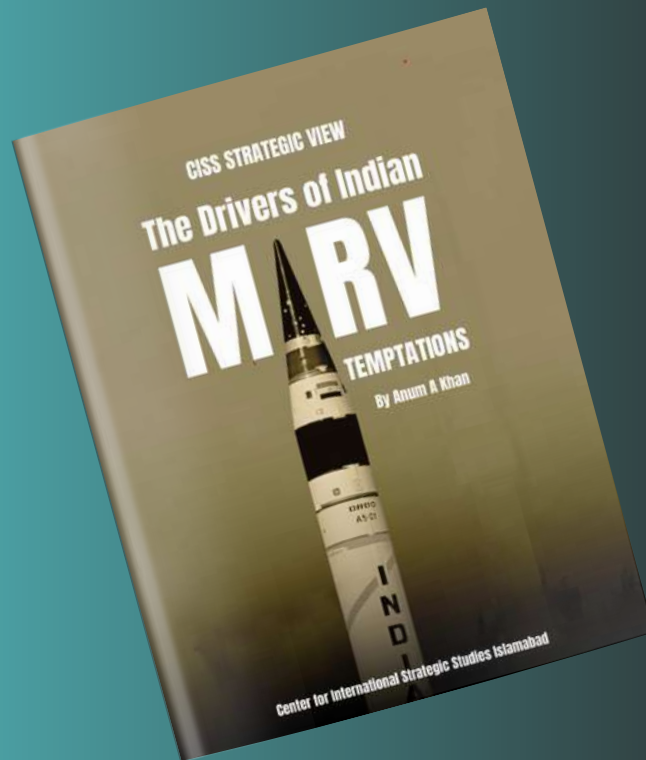

The Indian Air Force's launch of a nuclear-capable BrahMos supersonic cruise missile into Pakistan's Mian Channu in March 2022 sparked significant controversy. Following a Delhi High Court verdict demanding further details, the IAF's response suggests the launch was either inadvertent or deliberate, challenging the initial claims of an accidental launch. The distinction lies in inadvertence arising from negligence, while accidents occur unexpectedly, without intention. This analysis by Dr Atia Ali Kazmi concludes that the launch was unlikely accidental, posing serious implications for peacetime relations between nuclear nations. This unprecedented event underscores the need for vigilance and reflection among all nuclear powers.

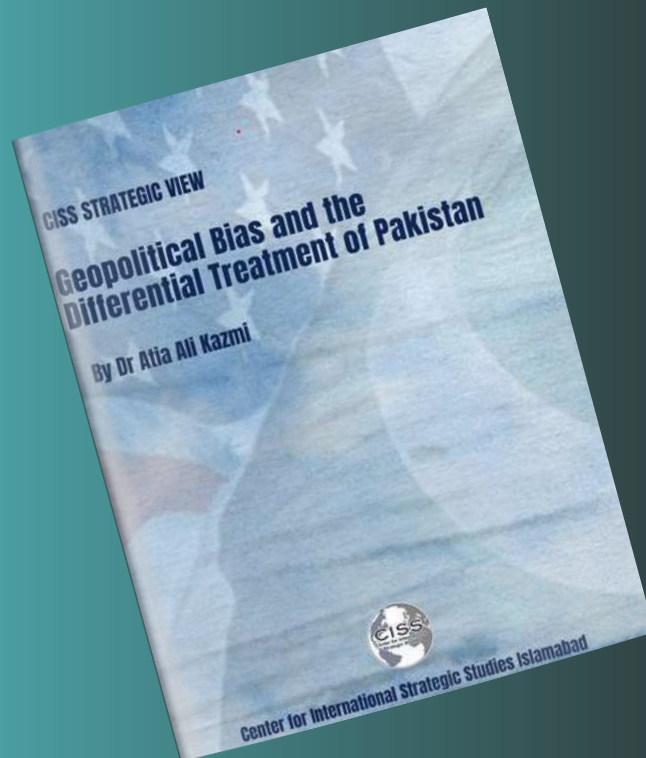

The continuous increase in numbers of Indian nuclear warheads, building Ballistic Missile Defenses (BMDs), and acquiring MIRV capability is an operational extension of Indian counter-force pre-emptive nuclear strikes, which can lead to the triggering of a potential nuclear war with catastrophic consequences for the region and beyond. This will be a sharp ‘coup-de-grâce’ to the strategic stability in the Pakistan-India dyad, where the onus of maintaining strategic stability will rest with Pakistan through a measured and restrained response.

The increasing pressure on Pakistan due to the US discouraging other countries from trading with it and imposing sanctions against Pakistani entities significantly hampers the socio-economic progress of the nation. This is starkly in contrast with the blind eye turned towards India despite its ongoing proliferation and expansion of sensitive military technologies. This imbalance stifles Pakistan's development and fosters regional instability by skewing the power dynamics. Moreover, this US strategy could also trigger significant shifts in public opinion and government policy in Pakistan. Such inconsistencies challenge the effectiveness and fairness of global non-proliferation objectives and international equity.

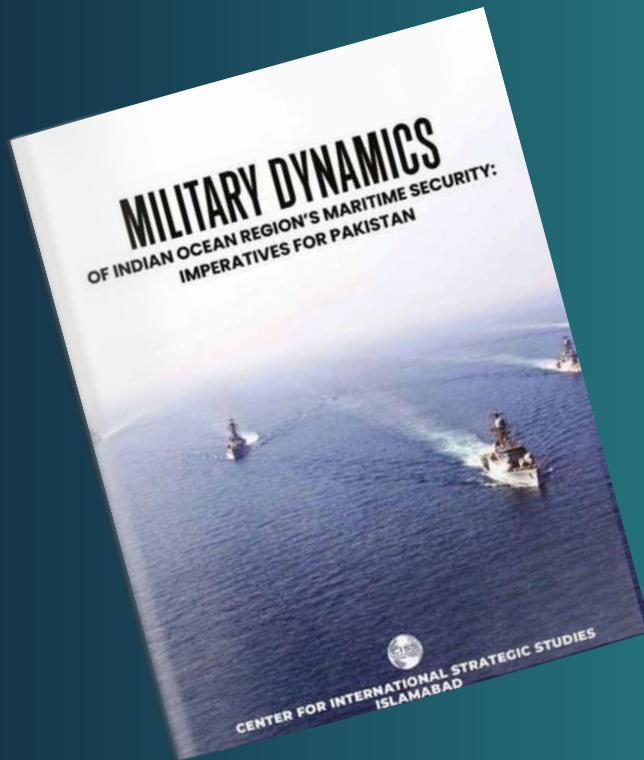

Report on Nuclear Safety Mechanism at the International Atomic Energy Agency and its Implementation in South Asia

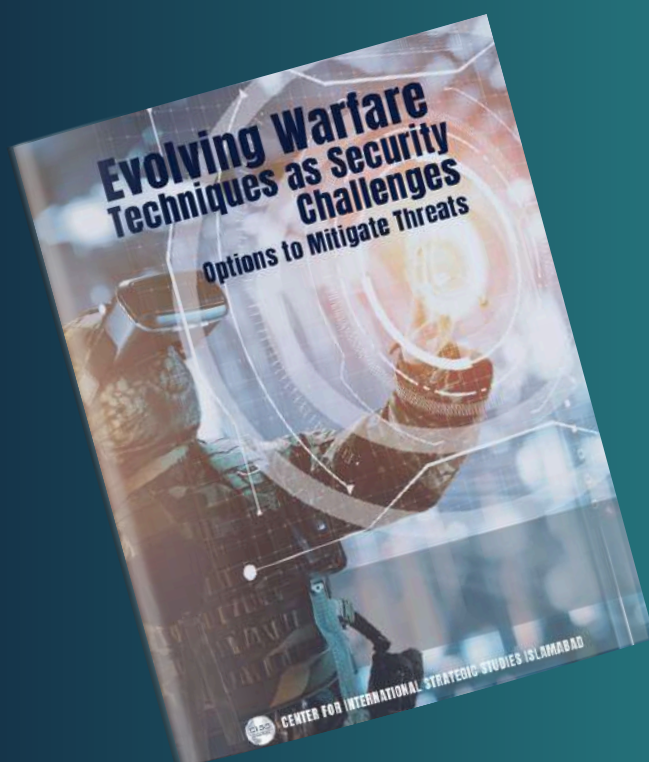

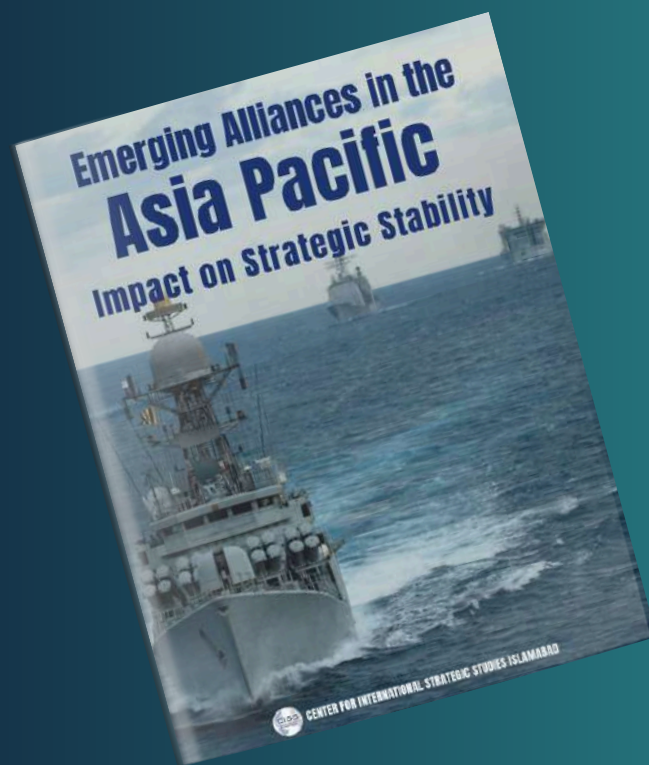
